



## New bride's dress

### Medium

1920 Cotton, wool, metallic thread, nylon, paper, metal, plastic

### Description

This dress consists of a dickey, a plain chemise embellished with lace on the sleeves and hem, a short-sleeved coat made from commercial wool fabric called kazmir, with fronts pinned back, an apron, a belt woven in the same technique as the apron, and a head scarf with flowers attached. Because it had to be purchased, kazmir had a higher value than the shayak produced at home. The municipality of Kriva Palanka borders on Serbia and Bulgaria; women on all sides of these borders wore a very

similar style of dress (Young Brides, Old Treasures: Macedonian Embroidered Dress, edited by Bobbie Sumberg, 2011).
