Description

Mala Reka, on the western border, is the original land of the Miyaks, who migrated south and east from here beginning in the eighteenth century. Depicted here is the dress of a bride on the fourth and final day of the wedding festivities, when she went to the water fountain in the center of town to ritually wash the hands of the wedding party. The toka chemise worn the day before, during the church ceremony, has a particular type of embroidery called pisani podvevci not seen on this chemise. Dressing began with a long-sleeved blouse, mintan, then the

chemise, a vest, elek, and finally a heavy wool coat with vestigial sleeves, klashenik (Young Brides, Old Treasures: Macedonian Embroidered Dress, edited by Bobbie Sumberg, 2011).
