Description

Both of handplaned pine in irregular diamond shape with narrow lance-shaped rays inserted in upper edges.

Plaques rays and candle holders covered with rosin and soot ground and decorated with fine geometric designs in wheat straw. Good examples of old candleholders, prior to advent of tin in New Mexico, and also of the craft of straw

applique.

Dimensions

a) plaque: $11 \frac{13}{16} \times 5 \frac{1}{2}$ in. (30×14 cm) a) candleholder: $5 \frac{1}{8} \times 1 \frac{3}{8} \times \frac{1}{2}$ in. ($13 \times 3.5 \times 1.2$ cm)

b) plaque: $11 \frac{13}{16} \times 4 \frac{15}{16} \times \frac{13}{16}$ in. ($30 \times 12.5 \times 2$ cm) b) candleholder: $4 \frac{3}{4} \times 1 \frac{9}{16} \times \frac{1}{2}$ in. ($12 \times 4 \times 1.2$ cm)
