## Description

A man wore this ensemble, a shirt, ayti, vest, elek, trousers, gakyi, belt, poyas, hat, shubara, and towel, krpa, on his wedding day with the addition of a jube or sleeveless coat normally only worn by a man in his fifties or older. A young man not yet married wouldn't have to wear the vest or hat. Although men's dress was less status-specific than women's, it was sometimes used to express change (Young Brides, Old Treasures:
